Aim: To equip clinical psychologists with the foundational knowledge and practical understanding of the use of Virtual Reality (VR) as an innovative intervention in palliative care. By addressing the biopsychosocial-spiritual needs of patients, participants will explore how VR-assisted psychological interventions can enhance quality of life, reduce distress, and provide meaningful experiences in end-of-life care.

Objective/ Intended Learning Outcome:

- 1. Gain foundational knowledge of VR technology and its evidence-based applications in palliative care.
- 2. Explore how VR can address patients' physical, emotional, social, and spiritual needs through case studies.
- 3. Understand the critical role of clinical psychologists in delivering VR-assisted assessment and interventions.
- 4. Identify risks and ethical challenges in using VR for palliative care interventions.
- 5. Learn practical approaches to implement VR-assisted interventions tailored to patient needs in palliative care.
- 6. Discover the technical, logistical, and collaborative requirements for integrating VR into clinical practice.
